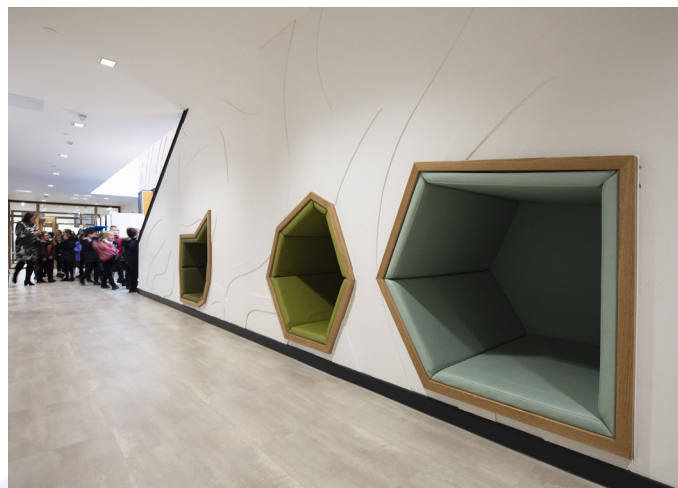
During construction, 12 high-school leavers were given the chance to get hands-on experience in the construction industry – gaining knowledge and practical skills geared at helping them go on to secure a job or apprenticeship.

To engage school and nursery children in the construction process and familiarise themselves with their new school environment, we modified a section of the perimeter hoarding to look like a castle. Complete with a viewing platform and windows, children could easily and safely view progress of the new build.

Other initiatives included activities around careers in construction.

Project information

The state-of-the-art Tullibody South Campus accommodates three educational spaces in one campus – a key element of Clackmannanshire Council’s Asset Management Strategy to rationalise council buildings, provide modern facilities and make the best use of council land.

The campus brings together Abercromby Primary School and St Bernadette’s RC Primary School, alongside a new early years nursery. Shared facilities include outdoor learning spaces, sports pitch, multifunctional learning spaces and an immersive, multi-sensory interactive learning room – enabling staff to adopt the latest teaching methods and technology to deliver the Curriculum for Excellence.

A community hub with library, meeting rooms and gym hall provides fantastic new amenities for local residents.

Before we could demolish the original school building to make room to construct the new campus within the grounds of Abercromby Primary School, we needed to build temporary classrooms. This temporary teaching village was completed in just 12 weeks, within a live school environment, and included water services, electrical supply, toilet blocks and access path.
